Hogsett Elected President of Association of Energy Engineers for 2012

Al Thumann, Executive Director, and Richard Costello, Chair of Nominations & Elections, have announced the Association of Energy Engineers Officers elected for the year 2012. Installation will take place at the AEE Awards Banquet on October 12 during the World Energy Engineering Congress at Navy Pier in Chicago.

President Gary Hogsett, P.E., C.E.M., LC, LEED, serves as the Program Manager for CB Richard Ellis Global Energy Services in Wichita, Kansas. Over a span of 30 years, Hogsett has held a wide range of energy management consulting positions. He previously served as the State Energy Engineer for the State of Kansas, as well as an Energy Analyst for the Oklahoma Energy Analysis and Diagnostic Center. He provided energy consulting for more than 1,400 facilities while employed by firms such as Johnson Controls, Tetra Tech, Mid-America Manufacturing Technology Center, and Burns & McDonnell. He was appointed by the Governor of Kansas to the Governor's Wind Energy Task Force.



Hogsett received both his Bachelor of Science and Master of Science degrees in Industrial Engineering from Oklahoma State University. He has served as Region IV Vice President and is currently a member of the Certified Energy Manager certification board. He is active in the Kansas City Chapter, and under his leadership as President, the Chapter was selected as AEE's Chapter of the Year.

Hogsett is an accomplished and passionate public speaker and trainer, and has won ten local and regional public speaking contests sponsored by Toastmasters International.



President-Elect William (Bill) Younger, C.E.M., C.B.E.P., C.E.A, Director of Commercial and Industrial Programs, CLEAResult Consulting, has over 25 years of experience in the development and administration of energy efficiency programs for utilities and state energy offices. He has provided training and technical support for a wide range of demand side management projects, utility tracking software programs, and web-based energy interval data presentment systems.

Prior to joining CLEAResult, Bill was the Manager of Business Energy Management for Puget Sound Energy (PSE) where he managed PSE's energy efficiency programs for commercial and industrial customers. As an energy specialist for the Washington State Energy Office and the Montana Department of Natural Resources and Conservation, he managed educational outreach programs, conservation retrofit grant programs, and implemented monitoring procedures to evaluate post-retrofit performance of energy efficiency projects in commercial and institutional buildings. He was a principal architect of the first series of seminars, exams and projects for the Building Operator Certification (BOC) program, which is now a nationally recognized training and certification program for commercial building operators.

Secretary Randy Haines, C.E.M., C.L.E.P., M.C.V.P., B.E.P., C.S.D.P., has thirty one (31) years' experience in project, maintenance and facilities management. The first seventeen (17) years of experience were in the metal working industry before moving to Thomas Jefferson University, an urban teaching hospital in center city Philadelphia. In 1997, Randy was promoted to a newly created position of Energy Manager for the Jefferson Health System, an alliance of hospitals and research buildings in the Philadelphia region covering more than 10 million square feet and 32,000 employees.



Using the metering system installed in the Jefferson Health System, Randy is actively managing the purchasing and selling of electric power.
