
Energy Management Jobs: Survey of the Energy Industry


Profile of Respondents


How many years of energy management experience do you have?

Do you feel that there will be a shortage of qualified professionals in the energy efficiency and renewable energy field within the next five years?




14% of AEE Members surveyed plan to retire within the next five years

34% of AEE Members surveyed plan to retire within the next ten years


50% say their companies plan to hire energy professionals in the next 12 months

Please input your base salary as of January 1, 2015








Are you a graduate from a 4-year accredited college?



Do you have a post-graduate degree from an accredited college?




Are you a registered Professional Engineer?




Are you a Registered Architect?




Do you hold a valid certification from AEE (i.e. CEM, CEA, BEP, CBCP, CMVP, etc.)?




78% of those surveyed feel they need additional training in the following topics




Are you a Certified Energy Manager® (CEM®)?




If you are a CEM, what would best describe your field of work?




What is most challenging about your job?
